2008 OLYMPIC GAMES - BEIJING, CHINA
Men and Women
July 26, 2006

I. SELECTION SYSTEM

A. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for nomination to the Team:

1. Citizenship: Athlete must be a U.S. Citizen and have a valid US passport at the start of the 2008 Olympic Games Trials.
2. Minimum International Judo Federation standards for participation (if any): The IJF has no minimum age requirement at this time. The Olympic Games qualification system will be provided by the IOC and will be posted on www.ijf.org as soon as it becomes available.
3. Other requirements (if any): Must be a member in good standing with USA Judo.

B. Provide a brief summary outlining how an athlete is selected as a nominee to the Team.

Senior Classification/Point System points will be accumulated during the time period starting April 23, 2007 until end of 2008 Senior National Championships.

The top eight (8) ranked athletes from the Senior Classification/Point System in each weight category per gender at the close of the 2008 Senior National Championships will be invited to the 2008 Olympic Games Trials to be held in May with a TBD date and location that will be posted on www.usjudo.org at least 45 days prior to the event. Should any of the top eight (8) ranked athletes decline to participate in the event invitations will be extended to the next eligible athlete on the Senior Classification/Point System.

The maximum team size is 14 athletes, one representing each weight category. The 14 weight categories are: Men (60kg, 66kg, 73kg, 81kg, 90kg, 100kg, and 100+kg) Women (48kg, 52kg, 57kg, 63kg, 70kg, 78kg, and 78+kg).

If the #1 seed wins the Trials he/she shall be the athlete selected in each weight category of competition. If the #1 seed loses the 2008 Olympic Games Trials the #1 seed and the winner of the 2008 Olympic Games Trials shall then engage in a best of three fight-off. The winner of that fight-off shall be the athlete selected for that weight category of competition and the loser of the fight-off will be the replacement team member.

If a weight division does not qualify a slot for the Olympic Games an official trial for that weight division will not be conducted at the 2008 Olympic Games Trials. An athlete who participates in a weight division that does not qualify for the Olympic Games may not transfer points earned in that weight division to another weight division. The athlete would have to move to another weight division to earn points and finish in the top eight (8) ranked athletes on the Senior Classification/Point System in the weight division he/she decides to participate.

C. Tryout Events:

2008 Olympic Games Trials will be held in May of 2008 with date and location TBD that will be posted on www.usjudo.org at least 45 days prior to the event.

- D. Provide a comprehensive, step-by-step description of the method that explains how athletes will go through the selection process to become team nominees.

Selection of Athletes and Replacements: Athletes eligible for participation in the 2008 Olympic Games Trials include the top eight (8) ranked athletes on the Senior Classification/ Point System at the close of the 2008 Senior National Championships (TBD, 2008, TBD location that will be posted on www.usjudo.org at least 45 days prior to the event). Should any of the top eight (8) ranked athletes decline to participate in the event invitations will be extended to the next eligible athlete on the Senior Classification/ Point System. Athletes are ranked according to Senior Classification/ Point System with respect to both classification and point level, i.e., a B Level athlete with 19 points ranks above a C Level athlete with 24 points. Athletes shall receive classification and points on the Senior national roster based on their finishes in various national and international events.

The Top eight (8) athletes on the System Point/Classification System will be seeded as follows:

In the first round the #1 seeded athlete fights the #8 seeded athlete, the #4 seeded athlete will fight the #5 seeded athlete, the #2 seeded athlete fights the #7 seeded athlete and the #3 seeded athlete will fight the #6 seeded athlete. In the semifinals the winner of #1 and #8 fights the winner of #4 and #5 and the winner of #2 and #7 fights the winner of #3 and #6. In the finals the winner of #1/#8 and #4/#5 fights the winner of #3/#6 and #2/#7.

If the #1 seed wins the Trials he/she shall be the athlete selected in each weight category of competition. The replacement athlete will be the winner of the loser bracket. Only those athletes that lost to the #1 seed will compete in the loser bracket.

If the #1 seed loses the Trials the #1 seed and the winner of the Trials shall then engage in a best of three fight-off. The winner of that fight-off shall be the athlete selected for that weight category of competition and the loser of the fight-off will be the replacement team member.

In weight categories where fight offs are needed, these matches will take place immediately following the completion of all of the gold medal matches during the same day's competition.

If the athlete selected and the replacement athlete according to the above criteria declines for any reason the person who is then ranked highest on the Senior Classification/Point System at the close of the 2008 Senior National Championships will be the athlete selected. Subsequent declines will result in a progressive movement down the Senior Classification/Point System according to the same criteria.

If a weight division does not qualify a slot for the Olympic Games an official trial for that weight division will not be conducted at the 2008 Olympic Games Trials. An athlete who participates in a weight division that does not qualify for the Olympic Games may not transfer points earned in that weight division to another weight division. The athlete would have to move to another weight division to earn points and finish in the top eight (8) ranked athletes on the Senior Classification/Point System in the weight division he/she decides to participate.

III. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

A. Prior to acceptance of nomination by the USOC, USA Judo has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is to be nominated to the Team by USA Judo may be removed from the Nominations for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Judo.

- Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the USA Judo CEO/Executive Director.
- Injury or illness is certified by an USA Judo physician (or medical staff). If an athlete refuses verification of their illness or injury by an USA Judo physician (or medical staff), their injury will be assumed to be disabling and they may be removed.
- Violation of the USA Judo Code of Conduct, (Attachment "A").

An athlete may be removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per the USA Judo Constitution and Bylaws Article 14 or by USOC Bylaws, Article 9.

B. After acceptance of nomination by the USOC, the USOC has jurisdiction over the Team and may be removed for any of the following reasons.

After acceptance of nomination by the USOC, the USOC has jurisdiction over the Team under the USOC Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures. This occurs no earlier than 45 days and no later than 30 days prior to the Opening Ceremonies of the Games (unless expressly waived by the USOC).

A USOC approved team member is subject to the USOC Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures.

C. Anti-Doping Removal.

An athlete may be removed from Nomination or from the Team at any time for violation of IOC, WADA, IJF, USADA and/or USOC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures. In such instances, the adjudication process will be managed through the United States Anti-Doping Agency.

1. Second place finisher at the 2008 Olympic Games Trials.
2. Senior Classification/Point System at the close of the 2008 Senior National Championships.



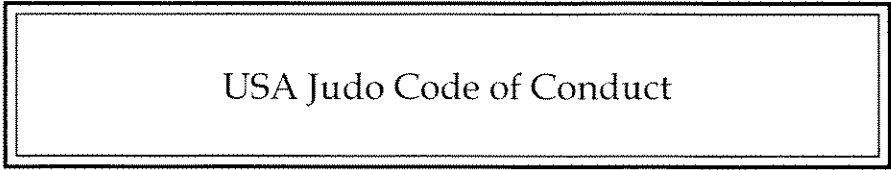

ATHLETE PLEDGE

I pledge to uphold the spirit of the USA Judo Code of Conduct (the “Code”), which offers a guide to my conduct as a member of the 2008 Olympic Team (the “Team”). I acknowledge that I have a right to a hearing if my opportunity to compete is denied or if I am charged with a violation of this Code.

I have familiarized myself with the Code and understand that acceptance of its provisions is a condition of my selection to the 2008 Olympic Team.

As a Member of the Team, I hereby promise and agree that I:

- will abide by all rules related to the Team selection procedures as approved by USA Judo;
- have acted and will act in a sportsmanlike manner consistent with the spirit of fair play and responsible conduct;
- will maintain a level of fitness and competitive readiness that will permit my performance to be at the maximum of my abilities;
- will not commit a doping violation as defined by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), the United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA), the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) or the International Judo Federation (IJF) rules;
- am not currently serving a suspension because of an anti-doping rule violation and have no pending or unresolved anti-doping rule violation, except as I have informed USA Judo in writing, and I understand that such suspension, or pending or unresolved anti-doping rule violation may be cause for my not being selected to the Team;
- will not engage in any conduct that is criminal under any laws applicable to me, including, but not limited to laws governing the possession and use of drugs and alcohol and providing of drugs to any person and of alcohol to minors;
- am eligible to compete under the rules of IJF;
- will refrain from conduct detracting from my ability or that of my teammates to attain peak performance;

- will respect the property of others whether personal or public;
- will respect members of my Team, other teams, spectators and officials, and engage in no form of discriminatory behavior or verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse;
- will follow my Team's rules, including by way of example, rules regarding curfew and required attendance at team meetings;
- am aware that USA Judo sponsors, suppliers and licensees provide critical support for the Team and, in recognition of this fact, I will wear designated USA Judo apparel at all official Team functions and events;
- will not conceal or cover-up any USA Judo sponsor, supplier or licensee brand or other identification appearing on my USA Judo apparel;
- agree to be filmed and photographed by the official photographer(s) and network(s) of USA Judo under conditions authorized by USA Judo and give event organizers and USA Judo the right to use my name, picture, likeness, and biographical information before, during and after the period of my participation in these activities to promote the activity in which I participate or to promote the success of the team on which I compete; in no event may USA Judo or the event organizers use or authorize the use of my name, picture, likeness, voice and biographical information for the purpose of trade, including any use in a manner that would imply an endorsement of any company, product, or service, without my written permission;
- will not use or authorize the use of photographs, films or videos of myself in my USA Judo apparel or equipment or the use of the USA Judo logo for the purpose of trade, without the prior written consent of the USA Judo (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld);
- will act in a way that will bring respect and honor to myself, my teammates, USA Judo and the United States; and
- will remember that at all times I am an ambassador for my sport, my country and the Olympic Movement.
